Purpose of Report				
Under the provisions of the Street Trading Act (NI) 2001 a district council has powers to designate or rescind the designation of specific streets or parts of streets as being suitable for stationary street trading by licence holders. The Act also allows a council to vary a previous designating resolution in relation to the commodities or services to be supplied in specific streets.				
If a street or the commodity to be offered has not been designated under the Act the council cannot issue a licence for street trading from a stationary position in that street.				
The process of considering and reviewing the designation of streets is therefore an essential part of the legal framework which enables the Council to regulate street trading in the City.				
Recommendations				
The Committee is required to consider an application that has been received for the creation of a new designated street to accommodate the stationary street trading site outlined in paragraph 3.3.				
Subject to any amendments you may have, permission is sought to allow the publication of the statutory 28-day notice of the proposed designation resolution and to commence consultation with statutory bodies and other persons who may have an interest in the proposal.				
Main Report				
Key Issues				
The Act sets down the procedures which must be followed in considering a designating resolution, including the types of trading which may or may not take place in that street. The main steps the Council must undertake may be summarised as follows:				
a) Give public notice of the proposed resolution in two or more local newspapers;b) Consult with the PSNI, the Department for Infrastructure and any other persons it considers appropriate;				
 c) Consider any representations relating to the proposed resolution which it has received; d) After the Council has considered those representations it may, if it thinks fit, pass the designating resolution; 				
e) Publish notice of the outcome for 2 consecutive weeks in 2 or more newspapers, giving not less than 28 days between the date of the publication and the date set out by the Council when the resolution will come into effect.				
A further report will be brought before the Committee at a future meeting detailing the outcome of the process of consultation. At that stage, Members will be able to determine the designation of the street along with any restriction on the commodity to be sold and any recommendations regarding the restriction on the times of trading.
