2.1	The Committee is asked to: • Agree that Council sign up to the revised Liaison Agreement for the Investigation of Work-Related Deaths.
	Main report
3.1	District councils and the Health and Safety Executive Northern Ireland (HSENI) are responsible, under Article 20 of the Health and Safety at Work (Northern Ireland) Order 1978, for making adequate arrangements for the enforcement of health and safety legislation with a view to securing the health, safety and welfare of workers and protecting others, principally the public.
3.2	District Councils investigate potential criminal offences relating to breaches of health and safety legislation in workplaces for which they are the relevant enforcing authority. Where a fatality occurs in such a premise, the district council will be responsible for leading the investigation and liaising with the other relevant parties.
3.3	The revised protocol ensures that the liaison arrangements previously agreed in 2007 remain in place, enabling parties to work together effectively during investigations of work-related deaths.
3.4	This Liaison Agreement is between Northern Ireland District Councils, HSENI, the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) and the Police Ombudsman for Northern Ireland (PONI). The agreement places emphasis the importance of the appropriate investigative agencies working together to ensure that a thorough investigation is carried out of work-related deaths in Northern Ireland.
3.5	The Liaison Agreement is not intended to cover the operational practices of the signatory organisations
