|     | Of the 450 river stretches looked at in Northern Ireland, 0% achieved good overall status, and 12% were given either poor or bad overall status. Only 31% achieved good ecological status, and just 2 stretches achieved high ecological status, and almost 70% failed to meet the requirements for good ecological status. This has impacted on the overall quality of Lough Neagh, which supplies over half the drinking water to Belfast, due to excess run-off from industrial agricultural processes.  This Council recognises that we are in the midst of a freshwater crisis in Northern |  |

Members will be aware that the provision of hospitality is through a number of catering contracts which may not currently provide for plant-based catering. Endorsing this pledge may also require additional expenditure for a number of departments which provide catering at Council events and facilities.
