3.0	Main Report			
	Key Issues			
3.1	The Committee will be aware that Standing Orders 13 (m) to (r), as agreed by the Council at its meeting on 4th October, are as follows:			
	(m)	The Standards and Business Committee will have delegated authority to adopt or reject Notices of Motion. The Lord Mayor will indicate at the Council meeting those Notices of Motion that have been considered by the Standards and Business Committee and whether such Notices of Motion were rejected or adopted. In either case, the proposer only may speak on the issue at Council.		
	(n)	The Standards and Business Committee will refer all Notices of Motion directly to a standing committee when the matter to which the Notice of Motion refers falls within the remit of that committee. At Council, the Lord Mayor will indicate that the Notice of Motion was received and referred. There will be no speakers on such Notices of Motion at Council.		
	(0)	The Standards and Business Committee will refer Notices of Motion for consideration by full Council when the Notice of Motion relates to a strategic or constitutional matter.		
	(p)	The Standards and Business Committee will not have the power to amend the wording of any Notice of Motion that is being referred to the full Council for debate.		
	(q)	Any amendments to Notice of Motions to be proposed at the Council are to be furnished at least one day in advance of going to the full Council and will be circulated to Party Group Leaders in advance of the Council meeting.		
	(r)	In referring any matter to the full Council, the Standards and Business Committee may determine to restrict contributions to the debate in relation to any Notice of Motion to one per political party. At the Council meeting, the Lord Mayor will clearly indicate if the restriction applies.

	Support for Striking Health Workers			
	"This Council notes with concern that health workers in Belfast are once again forced to take strike action for fair pay.			
	Health workers have faced long-term deterioration in conditions, a series of below inflation pay offers, and the additional work due to staff shortages and the ongoing crisis within the Health Service.			
	pay off	ouncil further notes that health workers are being offered an unsatisfactory fer in the midst of the cost-of-living crisis, as many who work full time are ing to make ends meet.		
	staff fa travellir	er to retain a vibrant and world class health service, it is vital that we reward hirly for the work which they carry out. High levels of agency usage, staffing to find better pay and conditions elsewhere, underfunding and privatisation ely undermining this aim.		

	The pandemic has shown how important our health service and the workers who staff it, are. Yet many NHS staff still suffer poverty wages and are forced to consider leaving a job they studied and worked hard to achieve.		
	The Council resolves to write to the Department for Health and the Secretary of State, in the absence of a Minister for Health, to urge them to source and provide a fair, above inflation pay rise for health workers.		
	The Council further resolves to show public support for health workers on pickets and to send a message of solidarity on behalf of Councillors to Unison, The Royal College of Nurses, and NIPSA, who are engaged in the action."
