	critical, particularly in terms of responding to the current Covid crisis and the associated		
	economic, social and environmental challenges. Recent research has highlighted that the		
	coming years are likely to see significant disruption to cities and that there is a need for		
	cities to consider now how they become 'future fit'.		
	In common with all other cities, Belfast has clearly been impacted by Covid. This impact is		
3.3	right across the city and in the context of the core city centre, recent announcements in the		
	retail sector have exacerbated many of the issues that existed pre-Covid. The criticality of		
	the city centre as a key economic and employment hub is well recognised.		
	Members will be aware of a number of priority areas of focus for the Council, as set out in		
3.4	the Council's Recovery Framework, including for example City Deal, the Future City Centre		
	Programme, Housing Led Regeneration, Resilience, Digital and Innovation, Connectivity
