While BSP no longer exists, that Lifelong Learning Group continues to meet – and the main focus of their activities remains the annual festival of learning, scheduled to take place in April next year. This is usually a week-long programme of events to promote learning opportunities across the board. It does not have a specific focus on any type of learning or any target group. Membership of the group involves Belfast City Council, UU, QUB, Forum for Adult Learning, BMC and a number of community-based learning partners.
