	Assessment against policy					
3.14	The Council's policy on the erection of a second street nameplate requires that at least fifteen percent (15%) of the occupiers surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second street sign in a language other than English, to progress to Committee for consideration.					
3.15	All of the surveys listed above demonstrate compliance with the threshold contained within the Policy.					
	Financial and Resource Implications					

3.16	There is a cost of approximately £2,400 to cover the cost of the manufacturing and erection of the dual language street signs. The cost for these street signs has been allowed for in the current budget.

	Each application for a dual language street sign is subject to an initial assessment for any potential adverse impacts on the grounds of equality, good relations and rural needs.
