3.1	Key Issues The power for the Council to name streets is contained in Article 11 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (NI) Order 1995.					
3.2	Members are asked to consider the following applications for naming new streets in the city. The application particulars are in order and the Royal Mail has no objections to the proposed names. The proposed new names are not contained in the Council's Streets Register and do not duplicate existing approved street names in the city.

3.4 3.5 3.6	Apex Housing Association have advised that Black Ridge Crescent and Black Ridge Road are derived from Divis (from Irish Dubhais 'black ridge'). The Divis mountain is situated north of the development. The second and third choices for Black Ridge Crescent are Black Ridge Close and Black Ridge Street. The second and third choices for Black Ridge Road are Black Ridge Parade and Black Ridge Street. These streets contain 32 residential properties and are part of the overall housing development that is known as Glenmona. The entire Glenmona site is a new mixed use urban development which will contain over 650 social and affordable homes.					
3.7	Applications for the erection of dual language street signs in Irish have been received from the developer for these two streets. Members are asked to note that at the March 2024 People and and Communities Committee it was agreed, and ratified by Full Council on 8 th April 2024, that delegated authority be given to the City Solicitor in relation to the approval of the erection of dual language street nameplates for this development.
