The High Sheriff, Councillor Sammy Douglas, will be hosting a group of young people from Ledley Hall Boys and Girls Club on their visit to the City Hall as part of a "Democracy Works?" programme.				
Ledley Hall Boys and Girls Club is a full-time youth centre based in Inner East Belfast, offering a wide range of personal and social development opportunities to young people aged from 5 to 25 years old.				
The Democracy Works? Programme explores local and national politics; how politics affects peoples' lives, who are the decision makers and how to influence change. The programme provides a broad introduction to democracy and politics and includes capacity building in conflict resolution and skills based working, and in exploring prejudice and perceptions. The group will next visit the Northern Ireland Assembly and the Houses of Parliament.				
The group's visit to the City Hall will include a discussion with the High Sheriff and a tour of the building.				
The group have also requested the use of the Council Chamber to hold a mock debate.
