1.1	To advise the committee of a planned event to engage with cultural stakeholders at the mid-		
	point of the ten-year cultural strategy, A City Imagining 2020-2030.		
2.0	Recommendation		
3.0	The Committee is asked to: I. Note the proposed Belfast Culture Forum event; II. Approve hospitality of up to £1700 for the event scheduled for 13 June in the Great Hall. Main Report		
3.1	At the mid-way point of our ten year cultural strategy, <i>A City Imagining 2020-2030</i> , it is proposed to bring together the city's cultural leaders, creatives and innovators, city policymakers and implementers. The Belfast Culture Forum, which is expected have an audience of over 100 people from across the cultural sector, provides a unique platform to connect, collaborate and exchange ideas about our collective role in improving people's lives through culture.		
3.2	 At the proposed event. Belfast City Council will share the latest updates about the work of the council, our partners and our cultural sector in context of a challenging backdrop. Discussions will highlight culture's role in building an inclusive city and region, creating social and economic value, and inspiring positive climate action. The focus will be on current and future collaboration to move forward as a cohesive city, and how we can do this better. Belfast City Council will talk about how we could do all this during the next five years of implementing Belfast's cultural strategy, A City Imagining! 		
3.3	This forum will help form the foundation of wider planning and development of an implementation plan for the next 5 years of the cultural strategy. This development will include future members engagement sessions with a view to bringing a draft implementation plan to members in Autumn 2025.		
4.0	Financial and Resource Implications It is proposed to provide hospitality for the event at a cost of up to £1700 to be resourced from the 2025/26 budget from existing departmental budgets for the Culture and Tourism section of the Economic Development division of the Place and Economy.
