- 27 occupiers (25.96%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 1 occupier (0.96%) had no preference either way.

3.7 Whitehall Parade, BT7

- 26 occupiers (45.61%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 10 occupiers (17.54%) were not in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 1 occupier (1.75%) had no preference either way.

3.8 Cricklewood Park, BT9

- 35 occupiers (29.16%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 15 occupiers (12.5%) were not in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 2 occupiers (1.66%) had no preference either way.

Old Bakers Court, BT6

- 23 occupiers (16.19%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 4 occupiers (2.81%) were not in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 3 occupiers (2.11%) had no preference either way.

3.10 Ashton Avenue, BT10

- 18 occupiers (40%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.
- 2 occupiers (4.44%) were not in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.

3.11 Azalea Gardens, BT17

• 5 occupiers (20.83%) were in favour of the erection of a second street name plate.

3.12 Assessment against policy

The Council's policy on the erection of a second street nameplate requires that at least fifteen percent (15%) of the occupiers surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second street sign in a language other than English, to progress to Committee for consideration.

All the surveys listed above demonstrate compliance with the threshold contained within the Policy.

Financial and Resource Implications

There is a cost of approximately £2070 to cover the cost of the manufacturing and erection of the dual language street signs. The cost for these street signs has been allowed for in the current budget.
