Aim

To maximise the engagement of Belfast's communities in the development of the Girdwood Community Hub, in relation to its design, programming and management.

Terms of Reference

- 1. To promote the Girdwood Community Hub, and provide feedback to and from local communities
- 2. To develop and recommend to the Council's Strategic Policy and Resources Committee a programme of work for the Girdwood Community Hub
- 3. To prioritise and co-ordinate the implementation of projects and programmes arising from the Girdwood Community Hub, including the shared space action plan
- 4. To engage relevant partners and support the integration and alignment of existing mainstream programmes including the Gaol
- 5. To monitor and review progress of the Girdwood Community Hub, providing regular feedback to the Strategic Policy and Resources Committee
- 6. To engage with local neighbourhoods and relevant public, private, voluntary and community sector organisations keeping them informed on regeneration at Girdwood Community Hub and wider site highlighting and addressing concerns
- 7. To oversee and quality assure the implementation of the engagement and equality strategies
- 8. To consider relevant 'best practice' models elsewhere and consider how this model can be replicated at other locations across the city.
