1	Relevant Background Information
1.1	The Council, at its Annual Meeting on 1st June, agreed to permit the 36th Ulster Division Memorial Association to use the City Hall on 10th September for an event to mark the formation of the Young Citizen Volunteers of Ireland (YCV)
1.2	In its application, the Association had explained that the event would comprise of a lecture, the launch of a booklet, musical entertainment and a small exhibition of YCV artefacts. The Association had also sought the use of any artefacts which the Council owned in relation to the YCV.

2	Key Issues
2.1	The Association has, on 20th August, written to the Council indicating that, as part of the event, they would like to lay a wreath at the "YCV Memorial" in the City Hall. This request did not form part of the original application.
2.2	The memorial in question is located half way up the staircase at the East Entrance area of the City Hall. It bears the following inscription:
	"Erected to the memory of the Officers and men of the 14th Battalion Royal Irish Rifles (Young Citizens) who fell in the Great War 1914-1918"
2.3	The Committee is requested to indicate if it wishes to accede to the request from the 36th Ulster Division Memorial Association.
