1	Relevant Background Information
1.1	The National Association of Councillors is holding a 'Localism Act and Neighbourhood Planning' Conference in Carlisle from Friday, 11th until Sunday, 13th January, 2013.
1.2	The Conference will focus on the concept of neighbourhood planning and how it is to be implemented to ensure communities become involved at a local level in shaping and influencing plans for their areas. The conference will be particularly relevant to Members given the central role Elected Representatives will have in community planning.
	A number of prominent speakers from across the tiers of government will address the conference and take part in a 'Question Time' session.
1.3	The council has been represented at NAC events for a number of years and representatives attending previous conferences have felt that their attendance gave them a valuable opportunity to meet with Local Government Representatives from throughout England, Scotland and Wales to discuss issues which are impacting on Local Authorities.
