1.	Relevant Background Information
1.1	This report presents a request from Common Purpose Belfast for financial assistance of £6,000 in connection with its 2013 Navigator programme for emerging leaders.
1.2	Members should note that the council provided similar funding in 2012.
1.3	Under Section 37 of the Local Government Finance Act (Northern Ireland) 2011, the council has discretion to consider exceptional requests for financial assistance.
	 The council has the statutory authority to make such payments Assistance is not available from the remit of another Committee
	The criteria for assessing requests for assistance which would fall within the council's special expenditure budget were approved by the Policy and Resources Committee on the 18 June 2004 and are included as Appendix 1.

Common Purpose programmes are designed to draw together local leaders, emerging leaders, and senior managers from all walks of life who could potentially play a role in shaping the future of Belfast. The council has supported

Common Purpose Belfast since its inception in 1996.

2.	Key Issues
21	Common Purpose Belfast has made a request to the council for £6,000 funding.
2.1	The money will be used to offer three part funded places on their Navigator

Programme for emerging leaders from non-profit organisations in Belfast. Last year council funded participants from Positive Futures, Cancer Focus NI and Mindwise (a mental health charity).

2.2 The application is being made in the context of Section 37 of the Local Government Finance Act (Northern Ireland) 2011. The Committee is advised that the application meets the criteria for funding and that the level of funding requested is affordable.

3. Resource Implications

3.1 Financial

A request for a contribution of £6,000, the sum which was provided in 2012, has been received by the Council. The Director of Finance and Resources has confirmed that this level of funding would be affordable to the Council within the Council's current budget.

4. Equality and Good Relations Implications

4.1 There are no equality or good relations implications associated with this report.

5. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Committee agrees a contribution of £6,000 to Common Purpose Belfast to be used to part-fund three participants on the Common Purpose Navigator Programme from non-profit organisations operating in Belfast and, if agreed, passes the undernoted resolution:

"That the expenditure in respect of the aforementioned event be approved under Section 37 of the Local Government Finance Act (Northern Ireland) 2011, it being the opinion of the Committee that the expenditure would be in the interest of, and would bring direct benefit to the District, and its inhabitants of the District, with the Committee being satisfied that the direct benefits so accruing would be commensurate with the payment to be made."

6. Decision Tracking

The Head of Finance and Performance will ensure that the payment is made to Common Purpose Belfast if approved by Committee and Council.
