1.1	To consider an application for the erection of a dual language street sign for an existing street within the City.
2.0	Recommendations
2.1	As at least two thirds of the total numbers of persons surveyed in the street are in favour of the proposal to erect a second street nameplate in Irish at St Galls Avenue, the Committee is asked to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Approve the application.

3.0 Main report

Key Issues

3.1 The power for the Council to consider applications to erect a second street nameplate in a language other than English is contained in Article 11 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (NI) Order 1995.

3.2 Members are asked to consider the following application to erect a second street nameplate showing the name of the street expressed in a language other than English. The second language is Irish.

3.4 The translation was authenticated by Queens University, the approved translator for Belfast City Council.

3.5 In accordance with the Council's policy for the erection of dual language street signs surveys of all persons appearing on the Electoral Register for the above street were carried out and the following responses were received.

3.6 St Gall's Avenue, BT13

31 people (77.5%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate

2 people (5%) had no preference either way

7 people (17.5%) did not respond to the survey

3.7 The Council's policy on the erection of a second street nameplate requires that at least two thirds (66.6%) of the people surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second street sign in a language other than English.
