	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • That a letter is forwarded on behalf of the Shared City Partnership to the Department for Justice Permanent Secretary endorsing the Community Attitudes to Peace Walls Survey findings and requesting an update in respect of what provision has been made to support action plans which would assist the target of removing barriers by 2023. • To note the update on PEACE IV and approve that delegated authority be assigned to the Director of City & Neighbourhood Services in respect of PEACE IV contracts • To agree the recommendations in relation to the Review of the Shared City Partnership as outlined in the minutes • That approval be granted for the provision of up to £1,500 to the Corrymeela Community to support its 'Inspire Peace' at the City Hall on Friday, 9th November. • That the Council provide up to £100 towards the cost of hospitality for up to 40 people at an event in the Reception Hall on the day of the 'Abandoned, Not Forgotten' exhibition. • That approval be granted for officers to commence the procurement exercise for the provision of beacons for use in 2018, at an approximate cost of £50,000 - £60,000 and agreement that this exercise could be halted should a subsequent decision be taken not to deliver any beacons in 2018.
