3.0 Main report Walking Football - Danderball 3.1 Lynne Wilson, Sports Development Officer provided the Reference Group with a video and presentation on the work undertaken by Age-Friendly Belfast supported by both the Belfast Community Sports Development Network and the Irish Football Association. She stated that the objective of Danderball was to increase older people's participation in physical activity and reduce the problem of social isolation. 3.2 The Danderball programme is taking place at Avoniel, Shankill and Olympia Leisure Centres and the Maureen Sheehan Centre. The Northern Ireland Walking Football Federation (N.I. W. F. F.) has been established to promote the sport and which was affiliated to the Irish Football Association (I.F.A.) to provide an official competition structure for the sport. 3.3 Age-friendly Belfast Convention and Launch of the Age- friendly Belfast Plan The annual Age-friendly Belfast Convention took place on 1st October, 2018. The Age-Friendly Belfast Plan 2018-2021(appendix 1) was launched at the convention by the Lord Mayor, Councillor Hargey and an overview of the Plan had been provided by the Chairperson of the Reference Group, Alderman Copeland. The Members were informed of the thematic areas identified within the plan including: Partnership Infrastructure Social Inclusion Health and Wellbeing and Financial Security 3.4 The Environmental Manager referred to the cross cutting themes within the plan, aimed at addressing life inequalities including the provision of support for dementia friendly communities. 3.5 Korber Foundation Symposium On Demographic Change Age-friendly Belfast were invited to Hamburg to host a workshop at the Korber Foundation annual symposium. Delegates at the symposium were impressed with the strategic approach taken by Belfast in becoming Age-friendly however, they had expressed surprise at the levels of inequality within the city. They were keen to learn from Belfast.

3.6 Welcome Meeting Room

Members of the Greater Belfast Seniors' Forum had requested the use of a city centre meeting area which they could use to as a discussion platform and as a means to coordinate their work and combat isolation at a recent meeting with the All Party Reference group. They had asked officers to explore the possibility of a room being available in City Hall for that purpose.

3.7 The People and Communities Committee is asked to consider the possibility of using the Welcome room in the city Hall for a short time as a pilot two half days a week as a drop in space for older people and approve a more detailed proposal to be developed and presented to the relevant committee.

3.8 U.K. Network of Age-friendly Communities Steering Group

In October Belfast hosted a meeting of the steering group. Members of the steering group were represented from other cities including London, Manchester, Bristol, Leeds, Wales and Scotland and that they were impressed with Age-friendly Belfast, the partnership work and the work of the Greater Belfast Senior's Forum. Belfast is recognised as one of the leading Age-friendly Cities in the U.K.

3.9 Age-friendly Belfast Positive Ageing Month 2018

Positive ageing month takes place in October, this year there were over 100 events organised throughout the city. It was a great success.
