3.9	Equality or Good Relations Implications/Rural Needs Assessment There are no direct equality/rural needs implications.
3.8	Financial & Resource Implications There is a cost of approximately £500 to cover the cost of the manufacturing and erection of the dual language street signs. The cost for these street signs has been allowed for in the current budget.
3.7	The Council's policy on the erection of a second street nameplate requires that at least two thirds (66.6%) of the people surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second street sign in a language other than English.
