3.0	Main Report
3.1	Key Issues  Members may be aware that the City Growth and Regeneration Committee, on 5th June, approved the participation of the Committee Chair, the Director of Economic Development (or their nominees) and one officer in the upcoming Boston outward visit.
3.2	The Mayor of Boston, Martin Walsh, has recently extended a personal invite to the Lord Mayor to join the visit to mark the Sister City agreement's fifth anniversary and explore, in partnership, further measures to strengthen the partnership.
3.3	Members will also be aware that the Belfast-Boston Sister City agreement was the first such international partnership signed by Mayor Walsh when he took up office in 2014. The purpose of the agreement is to develop mutual collaborations in the fields of economic development, tourism, education and culture.
3.4	Over the past 5 years, this partnership has resulted in tangible benefits for the city of Belfast. For example, each year Belfast welcomes an inward Boston delegation which aligns with the Friendship Four ice hockey held in the SSE Arena over Thanksgiving and attracts over 1000 international visitors over a five day period. This initiative was the initial output of the Sister City agreement and continues to grow in reach each year. Additional inward visits may also take place to coincide with the International Homecoming conference.
3.5	In terms of annual outward visits, the organisation and development of the itinerary is developed by the International Relations Unit in conjunction with both local stakeholders (in order to promote a Team Belfast approach) and the Office of the Mayor in Boston. Officers are completing this process at present, building on the success of prior missions which have led to specialised business mentoring programmes, awards by the Irish American Partnership to support the purchase of educational resources for Belfast primary schools, the scoping of the potential for the development of a Sister City philanthropic fund and youth exchanges.
3.6	Inclusion of the Lord Mayor in the pending outward delegation would demonstrate the level of support which Council allows to the Sister City agreement.
3.7	The budget for this mission has previously been agreed by City Growth and Regeneration Committee and will be met by the existing International Relations Unit allocation for this

	activity. A report on the visit outcomes will be detailed within the upcoming International Unit			
	update report.
