Standing Order 60(a) states any contract that exceeds the statutory amount (currently £30,000) shall be made under the Corporate Seal. Under Standing Order 51(b) the Corporate Seal can only be affixed when there is a resolution of the Council.

Standing Order 54 states that every contract shall comply with the relevant requirements of national and European legislation.

3.2 Single Tender Actions (STAs)

Clear Channel are the sole provider of bus stop advertising in Northern Ireland.

Global Protect are the sole provider of adverting on Metro Bus's in Northern Ireland.

The advertising is part of the communication plan to provide information to Belfast and Northern Ireland citizens on council initiatives

3.3 Green Electricity

The new electricity contract will commence on 31st March 2020 and the council has explored the option to switch to purchasing green electricity under the contract. This will help the council support its commitments to tackling climate change and achieving its environmental sustainability aims with the Belfast Agenda and Corporate Plan. The additional cost of switching to green electricity is circa £20k per annum (1.3% of £1.5m spend p.a) but can be subject to change (up or down) depending on market prices and site usage.
