The Committee will recall that, at its meeting on 31st July, it had agreed that a letter be forwarded to the Department for Communities requesting it to consider the installation in Rosemary Street of a statue in remembrance of Frederick Douglass, a slavery abolitionist.

A response has now been received from the Minister (copy attached).

In her response, the Minister has indicated that she would be content for her Department to partner with the Council to deliver the proposal.

She has also indicated that, if the Council was willing to lead the project and establish a steering group, to include other key stakeholders, such as the Department for Infrastructure, the Department for Communities and the Arts Council, to progress this piece of public art, her Department could provide part funding for the project and participate on the steering group.
