1.1	To update Members on the pending workshop with Elected Members on the Future of the City and the role of the City Centre.

3.0	Main report

3.1	In December 2020, CG&R Committee agreed that a workshop would be held for Committee	
	Members and Party Group Leaders to consider the Future of the City in the context of the Covid-19	
	pandemic and the associated social, economic and environmental challenges.	
3.2	In April 2021, the Committee received an update report and presentation on the Council's Future City	
	Centre (FCC) programme. The FCC Programme is linked to the longer term ambitions of the Belfast	
	Agenda and Belfast City Centre Regeneration and Investment Strategy but is also integral to the	
	delivery of the Council's Recovery Programme. It is charting a way forward for diversification of uses,	
	enhanced connectivity, investment and inclusive economic and cultural growth but it is recognised	
	that it needs to remain agile to deal with the ever changing challenges of the city centre. The FCC	
	programme currently has six cross cutting pillars aimed at revitalising the city centre and creating a	
	vibrant shared city centre where people will want to live, work and invest, but also enhancing	
	connectivity with surrounding communities.	
3.3	Members will be aware of a number of priority areas of focus for the Council, as set out in the	
	Council's Recovery Framework, including for example, City Deal, Housing Led Regeneration,	
	Resilience, Digital and Innovation, Connectivity and Active Travel, Economic Led Programmes etc.	
3.4	Delivering a multi-faceted approach to the recovery of the city centre and surrounding areas, in order	
	to support the recovery and growth of the wider city and region requires the collective effort of city	
	partners. This workshop provides the opportunity to discuss these priorities and to consider the	
	future role of the city centre and arterial route areas in creating investment, jobs and opportunities for	
	the city and its communities.	
3.5	Elected Members will have received a notice of the Workshop, which will be held Tuesday 25 <sup>th</sup> May	
	2021. Appendix 1 provides a proposed outline of the workshop including the desired outcome.
